M-E-M-O-R-A-N-D-U-M

To: ALL PERSONNEL ON ICE SHELF.

Subject: Safety precautions while riding sleds or vehicles.

- The attention of all hands is invited to the recent accidental death of a man from the U.S.S. YANCEY, caused by slipping or falling from a moving vehicle on the ice shelf.
- 2. It is directed that all passengers riding sleds, disembark and walk over both bridges on the bay ice and when coming down the steep slope from the barrier to the bay ice. Do not under any circumstances ride in such a location that a sudden jerk may cause you to fall in front of a sled or get caught by a tractor tread.
- All tractor drivers must be alert at all times to prevent accidents to personnel working near the vehicle.
- 4. Weasels are being abused to such an extent that several have broken down beyond reasonable repairs. It is directed that all weasels be driven at a speed not exceeding six miles per hour, and that not more than four people including the driver ride at any time.






